For less than a million dollars, buyers have single-family and condo options in Greenwich

One of the most-watched metrics in local real estate right now is "inventory" — or the number of homes for sale, related to the demand for homes. Despite what would typically be a slight summer slowdown in the market, this summer is seeing a steady stream of properties become available, at virtually all price points, including single-family homes and condominiums listed for less than \$1 million. Because demand for Greenwich homes remains high, properties tend to come and go quickly these days, so we're spotlighting new listings — as soon as they come to market across architectural style. neighborhood and price range. Here are a few under-a-million listings to make their market debuts this week:

Eileen Zawatski, a Realtor with William Raveis Real Estate, is the seller's agent for 21 Hunt Terrace, Greenwich — a two-bedroom 1,442-square-foot ranch on a 0.43-acre landscaped lot. The property is being sold "as is," and F.A.R. would allow for expansion or a rebuild up to 6,680 square feet, the brokerage notes in the listing description. The asking price is \$925,000. Zawatski is hosting a public open house at the property this Saturday, June 25, from 2 to 4 p.m. Over the course of 2021-2022, the one-bedroom condominium at 51 Forest Avenue, Apt. 134 in Old Greenwich was completely renovated. The 820-square-foot top-floor unit has cathedral ceilings, new windows, flooring and trim, and brandnew bathroom, with Porcelanosa stone and tile finishes. The kitchen was redesigned with Imperial Danby marble surfaces

and high-end applianc-

es from Thermador and Bosch. Realtor Randall Keleher, with Brown Harris Stevens, is the seller's agent. The asking price for the Old Greenwich Gables Association condo is \$849.000.

Another condominium option for less than \$1 million is the two-bedroom Unit 702 at 70 Riverdale Avenue. This is a two-bedroom condo, with three baths and 2,215 square feet of living space. It has a number of compelling attributes, including a gourmet eatin kitchen with high-end appliances, a spacious primary suite with a cathedral ceiling, hardwood floors, crown molding and a Sonos audio system. William Raveis Realtors Elizabeth Goldman and Billie Marie Manavola are the co-listing agents. The seller is asking \$899,000.
